### HKU DUPAD Degree Show 2016-2017



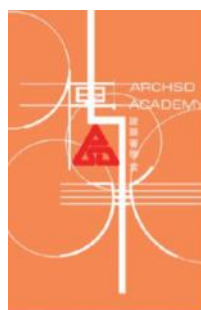

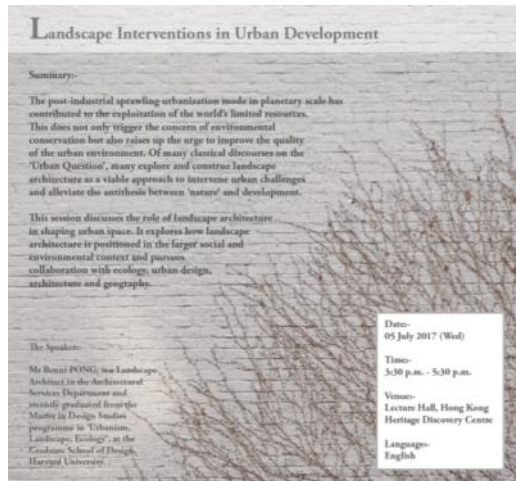

### Views from the Hong Kong Institute of Urban Design on the endorsement by the Executive Council on Elderly Services Programme Plan (ESPP)

(Hong Kong, 29 June 2017) The Hong Kong Institute of Urban Design would like to put forth the following views on the endorsement by the Executive Council on Elderly Services Programme Plan (ESPP) on 27 June 2017.

We welcome Government's timely action and direction, especially in view of the rapidly increasing elderly population.

Whilst we consider it is certainly essential in terms of equity, to provide supporting services to the elderly who are in need, HKIUD further suggests that our urban environment should be conducive to walkability, legibility, comfort and safety in order to postpone health and social problems associated with ageing. When the elderly population becomes more mobile, they would be able to live more actively and healthily in an inclusive and smart setting. The need for medical and social care will also thereby be reduced. We are confident that the Government will take a lead, as well as encourage the private sector to jointly create an age-friendly urban environment both in its new towns and in the redevelopment of the old urban areas. HKIUD will do its best to collaborate with Government and other experts and stakeholders in meeting this end.

HKIUD has started our efforts working with other experts and institutions in studying what we should do to achieve an Age-Friendly and Inclusive urban environment. We will consolidate our findings, and share with concerned parties in a biennial conference early next year. additions and/or amendments to the current B(P)R. Subsequently, participating organisations are asked to give more detailed consideration and to reply to a questionnaire before 18/8/2017. We are now inviting PAC members to also contribute their views.

A new session of the Harbourfront Commission has commenced from 1 July 2017. HKIUD will continue to be represented by Mr. Ivan Ho and Mr. P.Y. Tam this year. Ivan will also take up the workload of the HC's Task Forces on Harbourfront Developments on Hong Kong Island and Kai Tak and the Working Group on the Protection of the Harbour Ordinance, while PY will take up the work of the Task Force on Kowloon, Tsuen Wan & Kwai Tsing and the Water-land Interface. Members will be informed of issues arising from these meetings from time to time.

Abstract:

Kai Tak has been under the spotlight recently when record-breaking land sale prices came out one after another. Speculations on developers' Mainland background and strategies could no longer stand when lately a local developer tendered and won a Kai Tak site. Then, what are the reasons behind? What elements does Kai Tak possess that have appealed to these developers? Some say urban design clearly

plays a part. If it does, what have been painted in urban design? In this talk, different perspectives will be drawn from speakers who have played different roles linked to Kai Tak - Current Head of Kai Tak Office, President of HKIUD who was also the first Head of Kai Tak Office, Chairman of Kai Tak Harbourfront Development, and a developer that won the latest land tender at Kai Tak.
